

EDISON HIGH SCHOOL  
TRIP GENERAL STANDARD OF  
CONDUCT

As representatives of Edison High School, the City of Huntington Beach, the County of Orange, and the State of California, everyone will be expected to behave as mature and responsible adults and show proper respect for others and their property.

Applicable Huntington Beach Union High School District Board and Edison High School Policies and Regulations will be enforced, including policies and regulations concerning smoking and the use of alcohol and drugs. Any infractions will be referred to\*\_\_\_\_\_. If it is necessary, parents will be notified immediately and it will be the parents responsibility to arrange return travel at their expense. At the discretion of the administration the student may be removed from the team or group after notification of the parents. Suspension and possible removal from campus may occur if deemed appropriate by the administration.

Teachers and chaperons are to be kept informed as to students whereabouts at all times. No student is to leave the hotel grounds or any designated area without attaining permission from \* \_\_\_\_\_ and the chaperon chairperson, and shall be responsible for informing their assigned chaperon. The "buddy system" must be used by all students. Abuse of this rule may cause the student(s) to be suspended.

In case of illness or injury, the chaperone chairperson and \* \_\_\_\_\_ are to be notified immediately.

Free "souvenir" collecting of items of value will not be tolerated. Students and their parents will be responsible and billed for missing or damaged items. Damage to any area used by students will be paid for by the individual(s) causing the damage or those occupying the area.

Sponsors ( chaperons) and teachers of school related activity have the same authority as if students were in school.

Bus drivers will have complete authority while students are on their busses.

Luggage or other personal property may be examined by school officials when there is reasonable cause to believe that a Board Policy or School Regulation has been violated. Chaperons may ask parent or guardian to open their students luggage and check for undesirable items before departing Edison High School.

Students must be prompt and present for practices, performances, bus loading and other organized activities.

Students are not to rent or ride in any privately contracted vehicle.

Only radios, tape or CD players with earphones will be allowed on the trip.

Any relatives or friends visiting students must check in with the chaperon chairperson. A student cannot leave the hotel with any friend or relative without a note from their parent which includes the name of the friend or relative and their address and phone number. This note must be given to the chaperon chairperson at the luggage check-in or when designated by the chaperone chairperson.

Under Education Code 48900 (a, b, c, d, e, f, g, h, i,j, k, l,) students who engage in the following activities may be suspended from school:

- a. Caused attempted to cause, or threatened to cause physical injury to another person.
- b. possessed, sold or otherwise furnished any firearm, knife, explosive, or other dangerous object unless, in the case of possession of any object of this type the pupil had obtained written permission to possess the item from a certificated school employee which is concurred in by the principal or the designee of the principal.
- c. Unlawfully possessed, used, sold, or otherwise furnished, or been under the influence of, any controlled substance listed in Chapter 2 (commencing with Section 11053) of Division 10 of the Health and Safety Code, an alcoholic beverage, or an intoxicant of any kind
- d. Unlawfully offered, arranged, or negotiated to sell any controlled substance listed in Chapter 2 (commencing with section 11053) of Division of the Health and Safety Code, and alcoholic beverage, or an intoxicant of any kind and then either, sold, delivered, or otherwise furnished to any person another liquid, substance, or material as a controlled substance, alcoholic beverage, or intoxicant.
- e. Committed or attempted to commit robbery or extortion
- f. Caused or attempted to cause damage to school property or private property
- g. Stolen or attempted to steal school property or private property.
- h. Possessed or used tobacco, or any products containing tobacco or nicotine products, including but not limited to, cigarettes, cigars, miniature cigars, clove cigarettes, smokeless tobacco, snuff, chew packets, and betel.
- i. Committed an obscene act or engaged in habitual profanity or vulgarity.
- j. Had unlawful possession of, or unlawfully offered, arranged, or negotiated to sell any drug paraphernalia, as defined in Section 11014.5 of the Health and Safety Code
